## **General Open Class Rules & Regulations**

**Entries to the open class will be limited to residents of Buena Vista and the surrounding counties of Cherokee, Clay, Sac, Ida, and Pocahontas (unless stated otherwise in the "Department Rules"). Anyone entering items for judging must enter it in the name of the person who made the object. These objects should have been made in the last 2 years and not have been entered into the BV County Fair Open Class before. When entering, you must supply a full name, current address, and telephone number.**

**All entries will be accepted from 7pm - 9pm on Tuesday, July 19 and 8am - 10am on Wednesday, July 20 (gate fees will be charged on Wednesday, July 20) at the West end of the Secretary's Building. Judging will begin at 10:30 am on Wednesday,**

**July 20. Open Class exhibits will be displayed in the Secretary's Building. The Secretary's Building will be closed from 10:30 am until judging is finished and exhibits are displayed. Entries, ribbons, and premiums must be picked up between 2:30 pm and 3:30 pm on Sunday, July 24. Please make arrangements to have everything picked up at this time. Items or premiums not picked up, or arrangements made will be forfeited.**

## **PANTRY DEPARTMENT "A"**

### **RULES FOR ENTERING:**

1. Entries must be prepared by the exhibitor.
2. Unless otherwise stated, entry will consist of only one item.
3. Judge reserves the right to give only red and white ribbons if no blue ribbon quality is entered in that class.
4. All baked goods must be a complete article...not cut.
5. All cakes must be a minimum 8" x 8" or equivalent.
6. Bring bread and rolls on paper plates in clear plastic bags.
7. After all baked goods are judged, exhibitors may take home one half of entry if desired, except for "Best of Show" entries and decorated cakes and cookies.
8. In canning, only standard jars may be used. Green glass jars are not acceptable. Do NOT use mayonnaise or other lightweight jars. Either pint or quart jars may be used. Leave rings on when using two-piece lids.
9. Jams and jellies must be canned, not just topped with paraffin.
10. If you would like to bring an item not listed in the listing, please bring it to the Superintendent and she will make a class for it.
11. "Best of Show" will be awarded in the Senior and Junior Divisions.

# PHOTOGRAPHY DEPARTMENT "G"

1. Photos must have at least one dimension of 7" and no dimension larger than 16". Mats may not exceed dimensions of 16" X 20". No more than three entries can be entered, black & white or color.
2. Photographic print may be black & white or color and must have been taken by the contestant from the end of the previous year's fair through the beginning of the current fair. The photo must be mounted or matted with durable backing at the discretion of entrant. Clear protective coverings may be used such as shrink-wrap.
3. **FRAMED PRINTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED.** Reason being is that more often than not the frames take away from the aesthetic value of the image.
4. Photo may be processed commercially or printed at home by computer printers. However, any imperfections of home prints such as banding or color problems will seriously degrade image quality. Entrant is responsible to size, cropping, color balance, contrast, texture, and design of mounting/matting.
5. Convention rules of composition will apply: rule of thirds, converging lines, symmetrical designs, etc., correct exposure, depth of field, focus, and sharpness.
6. No names or dates (computer or hand written) should appear on the front of the photo.
7. "Best of Show" will be awarded in the senior and junior divisions.
